

Puanga Rising stars align this Friday!

With a new Matariki public holiday observed across New Zealand this week, Whanganui will celebrate its own form of the Māori New Year, Puanga, with a free community event in Majestic Square this Friday, 24 June 2022 from 5.30pm until 8.30pm.

Puanga Rising will feature a mix of live music, art displays, cultural performances and kai from a range of food stalls. The event will showcase a range of local performers including taonga pūoro practitioner Tom Carroll, storyteller Lisa Reweti, singer-songwriter Bobbi Rae and veteran reggae group Roots Providers along with waiata and kapa haka.

As well as live entertainment, the event will feature traditional Māori games facilitated by Sport Whanganui and Te Oranganui, digital art projections by local artists, traditional hīnaki (woven eel pots) on display and community art created by workshops at the Sarjeant Gallery Te Whare o Rehua Whanganui.



This event has been organised by Mainstreet Whanganui and Whanganui District Council, with support from the Whanganui Regional Māori Tourism Organisation and the Town Centre Regeneration project. Kowhai Park stopbank work

The majority of work begun in Kowhai Park early last month to close gaps in stopbanks where roads crossed through the park has been completed. Raising the road to the same level as the stopbanks is a joint project between Horizons Regional Council and Whanganui District

Road resealing in the affected areas - near the Kowhai Park barbecue area and a park entrance near the Anzac Parade slipway - is scheduled to be finished by the end of this month. The third site to be raised – the road by the Matarawa Stream bridge - will be completed after winter.

Flood barriers will no longer be required to be installed during a flood or storm event in these areas as a result of this work.

A call for planting day volunteers at Hylton Park



Volunteers are being called for a community planting day at Hylton Park in Aramoho this Saturday, 25 June 2022 from 9.00am until 1.00pm. This project is being organised by the Rotary Club of Whanganui with the assistance of Horizons Regional Council, and is the second stage of plantings for this area.

The aim is to plant 1200 native trees on the day. Volunteers are asked to bring a spade and gloves if possible. Please meet at the far end of Field Street near the park for a safety briefing at 9.00am, and dress for muddy conditions - wet weather gear is also advised. Some refreshments and a portable toilet will be provided.
