


QV property valuations available now

New rating valuations are being mailed to Whanganui property owners at present and are also available online at: www.qv.co.nz

Whanganui District Council's chief financial officer, Mike Fermor, says, "Some people think the council collects more rates when property values go up, but that's not correct.

"The total we collect in rates is calculated by working out the total cost of providing services and facilities for the community for the year. That doesn't change because property values go up."

He says what the revaluation can change is your "piece of the pie" or the amount you pay compared to others. "Revaluations help us work out everyone's share of the rates," Mike Fermor says.

Heritage Grant Fund open

Applications are open for Whanganui District Council's Heritage Grant Fund, which provides assistance to building owners to undertake heritage enhancement work. The grant can be used on external works that enhance the historic character of a heritage site.

The grant now covers not only the town centre but also heritage projects throughout the Whanganui district that show substantial benefits to the wider community. Privately-owned buildings are eligible to apply for funding, as are council and crown-owned buildings that are in community use. For projects up to \$15,000, applicants can be considered for up to 80 percent funding towards the total cost of the project, while for projects above \$15,000 owners can apply for up to 50 percent towards the total cost of the project. Funding applications must be made before work starts and the project needs to be completed within 12 months of funding approval.
