### Swimming spot safety messages for your video:

### Home pools

- Tamariki under five years of age and learners need to be actively supervised around water – keep them within arm's reach
- Make sure other children are within your sight at all times.
- Make sure your pool has a fence if it's meant to have one – for more information, visit the residential pools page on the council's website at: bit.ly/3Non2VZ

### **Beaches**

- Swim between the flags! Lifeguards are out with flags from 12 noon until 6pm every day over summer
- Watch out for rips they can look like:
- brown water from stirred-up sand
- a smoother surface with waves breaking on either side
- debris floating out to sea
- a rippled look when the water around is calm.

- Check the river's depth water levels change from day to day
- Look out for hidden logs or debris when diving and swimming
- You can use rowing club pontoons as long as you keep clear of rowers getting boats in and out of the water
- Keep clear of all boats.

- No swimming at Castlecliff Wharf it's dangerous!
- Head to Castlecliff Beach instead and swim between the flags.

# Volunteers recognised for historic rate records project

Whanganui District Council's historic rate records project team was awarded second place in the Outstanding Contribution to Heritage category at the Whanganui Regional Heritage Trust Awards held earlier this month.

The team – pictured, from left: Sonia Wooding, Nola Clark, June Springer, Sue O'Connor and Frances Haddock – and the late Joan Egan worked diligently over the past few years to digitise urban Whanganui rate records from the council's archive collection. This online database is a record of early settlers and their properties in Whanganui, and also documents Whanganui's development and growth as an urban settlement from the mid-19th century until 1928.

This historic database was added to the council's website as a digital resource in May 2021 and has been extremely well-used by the public – since it was published online, 128,072 individuals have accessed the database that includes 142,000 individual rate records.



This is a volunteer project managed and administered by the council's archivist, Simon Bloor, with support from the New Zealand Society of Genealogists (Whanganui branch) and the Alexander Library. To view the council's historic rates records database, please visit: bit.ly/3SYDqtV
